Military Landuses – First Thoughts on the Status of Worldwide Research

Assaf Shapira

This study surveys non-Israeli academic research on the topic of military land uses and the deployment of army camps since the early nineties, assuming that military land uses have significant effects on civilian lives, and therefore warrant systematic research. The study focuses on three levels; first: historical processes affecting military land uses and army camp deployment in the world, including political, technological, geo-strategic, environmental, planning and other processes; second: central research directions that have developed, which address the interdependence between military land uses and the civilian economy, environmental quality, civil land use planning etc.; third: fields that have not yet been thoroughly researched in depth, i.e. the "holes" in existing research.
